

The Opening Reception for our Spring Show is on Sunday, March 2, from 12:00 to 4:00 PM.

We will also have the library's long, beautiful table to display books, sculpture, pottery or glass for the day of the opening reception. We consider ourselves fortunate to have such an awesome venue for our exhibit. Please participate and let's make it a beautiful exhibit.

Flight of Fantasy: February Mini Workshop by Joanne Pacelli

This easy watercolor technique was taught to Joanne several years ago by a local artist, the late Lorna Francis. The process can be playful, surprising, and a bit addicting. Please come prepared to relax and have fun!

Supply List

- Watercolor palette (if you have one) or Watercolors and mini palette in the following colors (if you have them): Cobalt blue, Aureolin yellow (or lemon yellow), Rose madder genuine or permanent rose
- Watercolor brush in size 8 or 10, or whatever size you have. (I use a no. 8 Artists' Water Colour Sable, Pointed Round made by Winsor & Newton, which holds a lot of water and comes to a good point)
- Stylus or embossing tool or regular pencil (for mark making on the back of your paper)
- Paper towels and water container to clean your brush
- Stickles Glitter Glue (if you have it)
- Pencil and paper for note taking

If you lack any of these supplies, there will be a tube of each of the primary colors mentioned above for you to sample. There will also be a few tubes of Stickles for you to sample.

All paper for this workshop will be provided as well as styrofoam plates.

If you don't own a watercolor brush, Maggie will be bringing some of hers to share.

Bring what you have and come and enjoy!
