### Introduction to Color and Design

A Saturday Special with

Maggie Gillikin and Leslie Winakur

September 20th, 10AM—4PM, Parish Hall

Although calligraphers are often focused on making beautiful letters, we must be able to place those letters in an interesting, artistic environment. This class will provide students with a basic knowledge of the elements of color and design, allowing us all to make not just beautiful letters, but also beautiful calligraphic art. All lessons and exercises will be in a book which will always be handy for future reference.



### Student supply list:

- Pencil
- Eraser
- ZIG or Pigma markers, in black, size 2.0, 3.0, or 5.0, or other waterproof black marker
- Old practice lettering sheets (yes, really, the ones you think you should throw away)
- 12" metal ruler with cork back
- Scissors or X-acto with fresh blades and cutting mat
- 2 water containers, size of a 1 pound margarine tub
- Blue painters' tape, 3/4" or 1" wide
- Rag and/or paper towels and/or tissues (with NO lotion in them)
- Cheap bristle brush, 1/2" flat, for use with matte medium adhesive
- Watercolor brushes: round, size 4, 8, and 12, and flat, size 1/2". We recommend Winsor Newton brand, Sceptre Gold II, 101.
- Palette a regular watercolor palette—filled if you have it, or an empty white plastic palette or plastic plate
- Watercolor paints in tubes. Tubes come in two sizes, the smaller ones cost less, of course, but the larger ones are much more economical.
  - Aureolin yellow
  - Cadmium vellow
  - Cadmium red
  - Alizarin crimson (NOT hue or permanent in name)
  - Winsor blue (green shade)
  - Winsor Green (blue shade)
  - Ultramarine blue

**NOTE**: We have asked the vendors to bring brushes, watercolors, and palettes to the Calligraphy Exchange on August 21, so take advantage of the discounted prices that night and stock up on supplies.

**Maggie and Leslie will bring** the following supplies to share if you do not have all of the above. However, they suggest you purchase as many of the supplies as you can manage, since then you will be able to reproduce these exercises in your work in the future, using the same supplies you used in class.

- Book covers
- Book paper, 90 lb. cold press watercolor paper
- Colored acetate
- Red value finders
- Rice papers and collage papers
- Matte medium in containers
- Miscellaneous supplies

### **2014-2015 EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES**

In addition to the monthly meeting, SACG has numerous educational opportunities throughout the year. All meetings and classes are open to everyone, regardless of skill level or experience.

MINI WORKSHOPS... Mini workshops are scheduled on the third Thursday of the month from September through June (except November and December). We have a lot of fun

classes and activities planned this year. See Lenora Jordan to sign up for any you are interested in, or simply sign up for all them and you won't have to try to remember which you've signed up for and which you haven't. Classes are \$5 for members and \$6 for non-members. Topics this year include photography, lettering, bookmaking, and more! The cost to sign up for all eight mini workshops this year is \$40 for members. Where else can you get a two hour class taught by professional artists and teachers for \$5.00? Space is limited, so sign up now before they fill up!



**SATURDAY SPECIALS...** Saturday Specials are one-day classes taught by members of the guild. They are held in the Parish Hall from 10AM-4PM and cost \$20/class. This year's Saturday Specials include topics on stencils, lettering, and color and design. Contact Denise Cavanaugh for more information or to sign up. Be sure to check the calendar for dates.

MAJOR WORKSHOPS... We have two major workshops scheduled this year. Major workshops are two full days of classes taught by visiting teachers. This year's major

workshops will be taught by Jacqueline Sullivan and Pamela Paulsrud.

**MENTORING...** Members who are interested in individual learning opportunities can be paired with a mentor. Individuals and mentors are paired when both have expressed an interest in the program. Contact Betty-Lou Jordan if you are interested in learning more about the mentoring program.



**ENVELOPE EXCHANGE...** The Envelope Exchange is a good way to commit yourself to a small piece, be inspired by the work of others, and best of all, get something pretty in the mail! Sylvia Stanley will have more information about the exchange in November.

**SECRET PAL...** Though Secret Pal isn't a formal "class," it is an opportunity to challenge yourself in your art and calligraphy. There is no minimum skill requirement to participate, so consider participating to push the boundaries of your experience and put into practice some of the things you've learned over the year. You will accomplish things you didn't think possible and will be inspired by the work of other members as you receive pieces from your Secret Pal. More information about Secret Pal will be provided in January and February.





FALL AND SPRING EXHIBITS... Again, though the exhibits are not formal classes, keep them in mind as you work through the other opportunities the guild offers. The exhibits are an opportunity to challenge yourself, receive feedback from other members, and take pride in your accomplishments. Though the guild has guidelines for exhibited pieces, there is no skill-level requirement. Exhibit guidelines can be found in the Directory. Our Exhibit Chair for this coming year is Joanne Pacelli. Contact Joanne if you have questions about the requirements. More information about this year's exhibits will be available throughout the year.

#### STANDARD SUPPLY LIST

#### FOR ALL SACG WORKSHOPS

NOTE: This is a basic list of supplies for most SACG workshops. Check the newsletter for additional supplies required for specific workshops. If you need help understanding something on the list, ask an established member. They'll be glad to help!

- Paper & pen/pencil for taking notes
- Double ended pen handle, round barrel
- Nibs: 1 pointed nib (i.e. Nikko G or Brause EF66)
- 2 broad edged nibs (i.e. Mitchell # 5 or # 6 small and Mitchell #2 large)

  Note: Mitchell nibs are the most flexible, Tape nibs are medium flexibility and Brause nibs have the least flexibility)
- Mechanical or regular pencils: a soft (2B) and a hard (4-6H)
- Eraser white vinyl is good or a kneaded eraser
- Ruler 18" or longer metal cork-backed is best
- Scissors
- Xacto knife with #10 & #11 blades & empty Tic-Tac container (or other small container) for used blades this is a safety thing
- Slant board
- Gouaches Ivory Black (Windsor Newton or Schmincke are good brands) other colors of your choice
- Gum Arabic Windsor Newton brand
- Mixing pan, mixing brush, dropper & distilled water, spritz bottle with distilled water, and small container(s) with lid(s) to take home leftover mixed gouaches
- Water container for cleaning brushes, etc.
- Old toothbrush for cleaning nibs
- Paper towels the blue shop towels are the best
- Masking tape, blue artists/drafting tape
- Sharpie marker for labeling your tools everyone in class has the same stuff!

- 11 X 17 Calligraphy grid pad
- Crocus cloth 1 sheet
- Magnifier 8X 12X
- Mag-eyes / Optivisor
- Ott-Lite, extension cord(s), power strip
- · Cushion to sit on

- Munchies & drink
- Pliers for opening tubes of gouache and/or paints
