




<u>Major Workshop - Traditional Raised and Burnished Gesso Gilding</u> with Ken Harris


Have you ever marveled at the beautiful illuminated manuscripts of the Middle Ages? Have you ever asked yourself how it is that these amazing illustrations, painted in vivid colors and gilded with real gold, have survived for hundreds of years and not lost a bit of their beauty? This is the class that will teach you the secrets of the medievalists and their art.





Classic gilding such as raised and burnished gold, involves techniques that have come down to us from the Middle Ages. You will grind ingredients to create the gesso (or ground) that supports the gold, lay the liquid gesso on your design, apply the gold and then polish it to a mirror brightness. Once your design is finished it will be ready for the next process - the application of color.o
